**Activity / Resource Type:** Game

**Title:** Hungry Frog

**Description:** This game supports the development of fine motor skills while also introducing a cultural teaching about the frog.

**Material Needed:**

Boxes, plastic insects, and tongs.

**How-To:** Take a medium or small-sized box and seal it shut. Paint the box and add features like eyes, legs, and spots to make it resemble a frog. Draw and cut out a mouth opening so children can ‘feed’ insects into the frog’s mouth.

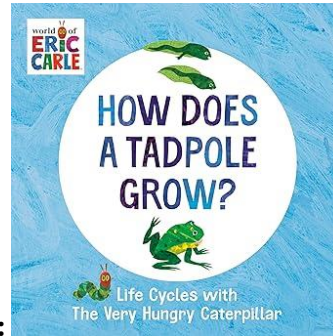
**Variations:** Invite the children to explore and learn about the different insects that frogs eat. Talk to the children about the life cycle of the frog. Encourage them to reflect on the cultural teaching about the frog and extend the learning by singing frog songs or counting the insects as they feed them into the frog’s mouth.

**Cultural Teaching:** The importance of Froggy -“Froggy” (Pipehò:m)

“Froggy loves to eat flies and mosquitoes. He sings at night— ‘Ribbit, Ribbit!’ Froggy is very close to Mother Earth. He is here to look after her.”
